

As the Summer term ended, there was an enormous effort by the staff to empty hundreds of books from the KS2 library shelves as Mr Fish prepared and painted walls in readiness for the fitters.

Having committed £16,000 to the library refurbishment, we were eager to see the outcome.

On our return in September, Miss Williamson greeted us with the most enormous smile and proudly showed us the transformation.

This project could not have been possible without all the funding support given by parents, carers and local businesses so a massive thank you again for your generosity.

We are now almost halfway towards our fundraising target for the KS1 library refurbishment which we hope to realise in 2020.

Spending Summary

No Buzz would be complete without a summary of our outgoings for this term. We spend a huge amount of time raising money and it's important that you know how it's being allocated and spent. As is often the case in this first term back, our outgoings have been minimal but we have earmarked available funds for a number of activities:

Year 2 enjoyed a Polar Regions Workshop in early October, partly subsidised by BPSCA. Each year group has been allocated £400 to spend on trips and class resources this year.

Year 3 Ukulele lessons will be fully funded by BPSCA at a cost of £3,960.

£960 has been set aside to cover the cost of the Year 6 Leavers Disco and gifts.

With Years 3 & 6 benefitting from two dedicated activities, we will make available a further £1,250 across the other year groups to use as they wish.

£750 will be contributed towards dedicated Science, English and Maths weeks.

£400 has been allocated for playground toys and £150 for class rewards.

All of this is in addition to almost £4,000 for outdoor project work and well over £5,000 already accrued for the KS1 library.
