Here's a summary of our spending allocations so far for this academic year:





£4,050: Classroom Resources £4,000: Ukulele Lessons for Yr3

£1,000: Celebrations

£750: Science, English & Maths

Week's Activities £400: Playground Toys

£400: Festive Activities £150: Class Rewards





In addition to this, we are providing £5,000 to cover the cost of new sound systems for both the KS1 & KS2 halls. These will be installed within the next few weeks.

Just before we went into lockdown in March, we received the exciting news that the BPSCA KS1 library project had been selected for voting on instore under the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.

We were all set to receive between £500-£2.000 towards the project.

We had literally just announced it in the weekly newsletter when Groundwork UK, who administer the programme on behalf of Tesco, contacted us to let us know that instore voting had been postponed for health & safety reasons due to the pandemic.

Whilst this was very disappointing, it was entirely understandable given the circumstances.

We recently applied for a £500 grant from the Tesco Bags of Help COVID-19 Communities Fund but unfortunately were not successful.

However, we have been assured that as soon as instore voting recommences, our library project will go straight into the vote, picking up from where things left off in March.
