- ◆ Children do well, whatever their background, when parents and schools work in partnership
- ◆ We will listen to you and ask you to listen to us
- ◆ Parents are the first educators!
- ◆ Reception is the most important year of a child's school life

- ◆ They see home and school working together



The importance of the Home-School Agreement

- ◆ Key document – please read it and understand it
- ◆ We will do all we can to ensure we do what we have said we will do
- ◆ Our school is a fully inclusive school where each child is valued equally
- ◆ Our passion is your children and their happiness and achievement but we only do this successfully together



We ask you to...

- ◆ Bring them to school, on time, every day and with the correct equipment (no rucksacks!)
- ◆ Communicate with us
- ◆ Come to meetings and events
- ◆ Read what we send home!
- ◆ Support your child with reading
- ◆ Take them on holiday in the 13 weeks of school holidays. NO holiday will be authorised by the school and you may receive a fine



Each child will



- ◆ Understand that they and others have a right to be happy
- ◆ Take responsibility
- ◆ Do their very best work
- ◆ Respect all other children's and adults' cultures, race, beliefs and feelings
- ◆ Follow the Behaviour Code
- ◆ Be kind and speak politely
- ◆ Take care of the building, the grounds and all the school's resources
- ◆ Tell someone if they are unhappy or worried

Starting school



- ◆ All children have a phased introduction to school over the first two weeks
- ◆ For this time we are unable to accommodate fulltime
- ◆ Choose whether to start part-time or full-time after this period of introduction
- ◆ Let us know on the form in the pack by the date given

Why is a phased start so important?

- ◆ Pre-school and child care are very different environments from Reception
- ◆ A phased introduction works and reduces anxiety for the children as they are introduced to aspects more slowly
- ◆ A good start is vital



- ◆ Keep us informed
- ◆ Read with your child – we recommend the library and Lions Bookshop in the village for great books
- ◆ Play with your child – and let them play without you!
- ◆ Sleep and breakfast are vital for a good day at school
- ◆ Encourage them to have the free hot meal not pack lunches
- ◆ Come to school events – especially parents' evenings

- ◆ Toilet skills
- ◆ Knife and fork
