Dear Parents and Carers,


We have had a great start back at school after the Easter break and it has been lovely to see all of the children excited about their learning.

Year 5 explored the lives of some influential Viking kings, leading up to the dramatic end of Viking rule in 1066 at the Battle of Hastings. Lots of fun was had at the start of their new topic!


Celebrate Earth Day at the Plant to Plate Festival Saturday 26 April, 10am to 4pm, Horsham








West Sussex Road Safety Link
