Following on from the work we did in Science Week, we have been watching a live feed of two nesting birds.

Peregrine Falcon: The peregrine falcon is nesting at a site at Nottingham University. Over the past term, we have been watching the bird's four eggs. On the 1st May two hatched. We decided to name the first one to hatch, Snowball and the second one, Pom. We are still waiting for two more to hatch. We are really looking forward to watching how their mum feeds them.

Osprey: Over the past two weeks we have also been watching a mum and dad osprey. The ospreys have a nest with four eggs but none of them have hatched yet.
