As historians, we will think about our day at school and place events in chronological order. Children will be talking about their own lives and the people in their lives.

As athletes, we will be learning how to roll and dribble a ball accurately with our hands. We will also be focusing on the importance of dribbling into a space. When we are inside, we will be exploring balancing, rolling and linking movements together.

As scientists, we will be naming body parts and exploring our senses. We will be going on listening walks around the school, using our sense of touch to explore different textures and describing what can see through magnifying glasses.

As computer scientists, we will know how to safely access information online. We will use cameras and the iPads to take photos and then edit these using paint.

As readers and writers, we will be going on exciting adventures during our Drawing Club sessions. We will be exploring characters and settings and using our imagination to take us to new places! We will be using descriptive language, punctuation and extended sentences!

As mathematicians, we will be comparing numbers up to 10. We will be exploring capacity, weight, length and height. We will be starting to use the part, part whole model to show how numbers can be split into parts.

As designers, we will be learning how to use the skills of cutting, peeling and grating safely and to create a delicious sandwich for our picnic.












Reading







During our reading sessions, we will be encouraging children to make predictions, explain what has happened in a story and bring the text to life through drama.

How to support at home

Reading:

- ➤ Your children will be sent home with an appropriate RWI book every Friday.
- ► In addition to this, they will also have a book online (Oxford Owl-logins in their reading records).
- Spellings Children to practise the spellings set on Oxford Owl along with their book.
- ► Children will bring home a book to share over the half term holidays. Please make sure they come back to school when we come back.

Reading records

- When you read with your children, please do write a comment in their reading records. Reading records are looked at on Fridays and names added into the school reading raffle draw to win a new book!
- The adults they read with at school will also write in these.
- Please try to ensure that your child reads every night for 10 minutes.
- Whilst you are reading, please support your child to learn key
 words and ask questions about the books that they are reading.
 For example, sounded out "sunshine", developing the 'ire'
 sound. (Leaflet with comment ideas and how to support reading
 at home).

English-Drawing club and Curious Quests

- This year, the children will develop their writing skills by learning how to use capital letters, finger spaces, full stops and how to extend their sentences with 'and'.
- Drawing club until October half term and then Curious Quests begins...
- <u>Drawing club</u> programme which fosters early literacy, imagination, vocabulary, early writing and story-telling. It is playful and open ended, with adults guiding and using rich vocabulary (shared in classroom windows weekly).
- <u>Curious quests</u> extends and builds on drawing club. It is about immersive adventure, where the children can invent and imagine. It uses open ended resources in the provision to support creativity and imagination. We use short carpet sessions and group work which incorporates phonics, SPAG and vocabulary. It's not about writing specific text types, the aim is to preserve joy, creativity and a sense that writing is done for the children. It adds more structure in Year 1 around reading, SPAG and phonics, but still in a joyful, open-ended way.
- Children will develop their stamina for writing by extending their sentences

<u>Maths</u>

- This year, children will develop their understanding of place value for two-digit numbers up to 20 as well as adding and subtracting. This will including ordering numbers to 100.
- Children will be developing their fluency in maths by doing 15 minute 'Number Sense' lessons.
- Children are encouraged to write 1 digit in each square.
- The children will learn all of their bonds to 10 and 20 and be able to count in 2's, 5's and 10's.
