Dear Families,

As we reach the end of another fantastic half term, I would like to take a moment to thank all of our children and staff for their hard work, creativity, and positivity over the past few weeks. 



Book of the Week!

Year 6 - Shadow Puppets

In Art lessons, Year 6 have stepped into history and creativity by making their own shadow puppets, inspired by pioneering German animation artist Lotte Reiniger. After learning about evacuation during the Second World War, the children designed characters, cut intricate silhouettes and brought powerful stories to life using light and shadow, linking beautifully with their Science topic on light. Using iMovie, they filmed and edited their performances, adding sound and titles to enhance the final pieces! A great cross curricular project and some OUTSTANDING results! Well done, Year 6!



Learning Gear of the Week!

Our **TEAM** learning gear helps children develop the skills they need to work positively and successfully with others. In school, children are encouraged to be active listeners, share their ideas and work collaboratively to solve problems. They learn that discussing, debating and reflecting together helps everyone's thinking grow.

Children are supported to be accepting of others, recognising that everyone brings different strengths, perspectives and experiences. They practise sharing roles and responsibilities, and learn how to give and receive constructive feedback in a respectful way. Through this, children understand that working as part of a team helps them achieve more than they could on their own.

At home you could:

Encourage active listening: Remind children to listen carefully to others without interrupting.

Create opportunities to share ideas: Ask open questions and invite everyone's thoughts during conversations.

Promote teamwork: Involve children in tasks that require working together, such as cooking, tidying or planning activities.

Model respectful discussion: Show how to agree, disagree and debate kindly.

Celebrate differences: Talk about how everyone has different strengths that help a team succeed.

Share responsibilities: Give children roles within family routines so they experience being part of a team.

Practise constructive feedback: Encourage children to say what went well and what could be improved in a positive way.



Year 5 - Catapults


Last week, Year 5 took their learning on Forces to the next level by building catapults! Working in teams, the children designed and tested their structures, thinking carefully about strength, distance, and accuracy. After launching their projectiles, each group reflected on what went well and how they could improve their levers or adjust angles to achieve longer, more precise shots. Their creativity and teamwork helped them build excellent “defences” for our imaginary cities!



EYFS - Starry Night Art

Early Years have been inspired by Vincent Van Gogh's famous masterpiece, *Starry Night*! The children explored the artwork, discussing the patterns, shapes, and colours they could see.

They then worked collaboratively to create their own large-scale pieces, bringing Van Gogh's swirling skies and vibrant colours to life in their unique way.



Year 5 - Circus Workshop

On Monday, Year 5 enjoyed a fantastic enrichment visit from a circus instructor. The children practised a range of skills, including plate spinning, juggling and flower sticks, while also thinking about the forces involved in keeping the equipment moving. It was a fun and engaging session that combined physical skills with scientific thinking — and, as you can see from the photos, we may have some future performers in Year 5!

West Sussex Cost of Living Survey 2025/2026

Arun & Chichester Citizens Advice has been closely monitoring the rising cost of living over the past few years and is keen to understand more about how people in local communities are coping with increasing prices for essentials. This year, the organization has partnered with Citizens Advice in West Sussex (North, South, East) to extend the investigation across the whole of West Sussex.

Responses to this survey will provide deeper insight into the specific issues people are struggling with and will help inform how support is offered to clients and communities in the future. This is the fourth survey of its kind, so participation is encouraged even from those who have completed previous surveys, as the organisation aims to track how the cost-of-living crisis is developing.
