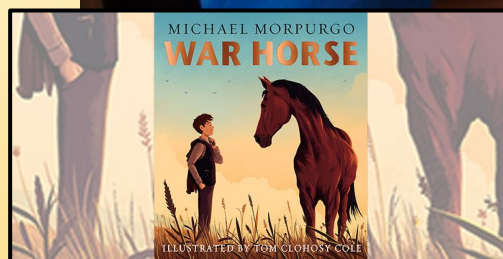
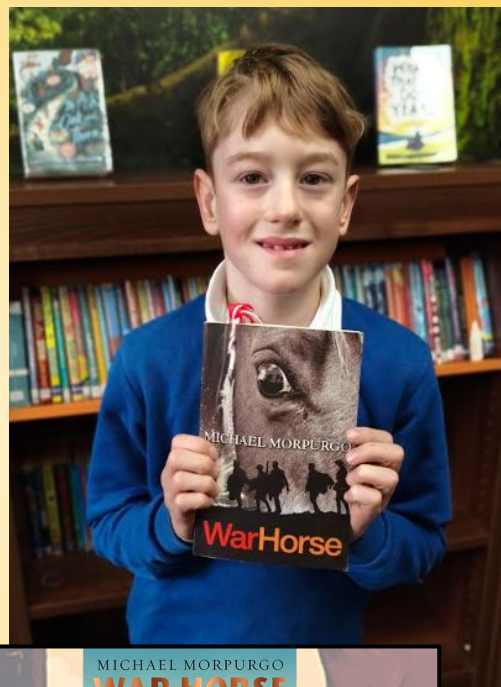
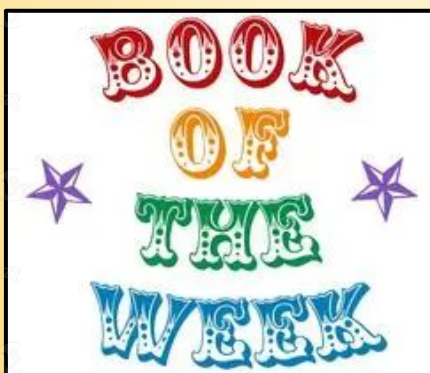

Year 2 - Zoolab!

This week Year 2 had a fantastic visit from Zoolab, who provided the children with a fascinating and interactive animal experience.

During the session, the children had the exciting opportunity to see a scorpion, snakes, a giant cockroach, and even a giant snail up close. They learned many interesting facts about each animal, asked thoughtful questions, and showed great enthusiasm and bravery throughout.

The visit was both educational and engaging, linking perfectly to their current learning about life cycles. It also sparked lots of curiosity and discussion back in the classroom. Well done, Year 2!



Learning Gear of the Week!

Our **Thinking and Questioning** Learning Gear helps children become curious, creative and confident thinkers. In school, children are encouraged to understand that their brain grows stronger through learning and challenge. They ask lots of different types of questions, from exploring new ideas to probing deeper into topics. Through talk and discussion, children develop their thinking, share viewpoints and learn from one another. They are supported to form thoughtful opinions, justify their ideas and respond positively to others, even revising their views when needed. This helps children become active, critical learners who enjoy discovering more about the world.

At home you could:

Celebrate curiosity: Encourage children to ask lots of questions about the world around them.

Talk about growing brains: Remind children that their brain gets stronger every time they learn something new.

Use different types of questions: Ask exploratory questions like *What might happen if...?* or probing ones like *Why do you think that is?*

Develop ideas together: Let children share thoughts and help them build on them through discussion.

Encourage talk and debate: Chat about books, news or everyday events and explore different viewpoints.

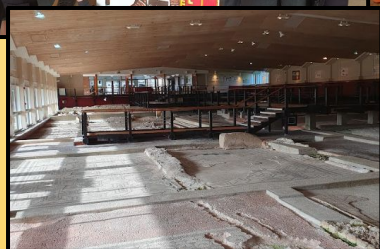
Support critical thinking: Ask children to explain their opinions and give reasons for what they think.

Model listening and adapting: Show that it's okay to change your mind when you hear a good idea from someone else.

On Thursday, Year 3 visited Fishbourne Roman Palace and enjoyed an exciting day of learning. The children were incredibly lucky to have the whole grounds to themselves, making the experience even more memorable. They had a fantastic opportunity to explore what life would have been like living in a palace during the Roman period. The day included fun and engaging workshop activities, time spent discovering the remains of intricate mosaics, and a visit to a replica Roman garden. The school is extremely proud of the entire year group, who were amazing throughout the day and showed excellent enthusiasm and engagement in every activity. Well done, Year 3!

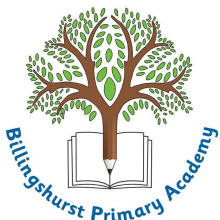
