Starting school



 All children have a phased introduction to school over the first two weeks For this time we are unable to accommodate fulltime Choose whether to start part-time or full-time after this period of introduction Let us know on the form in the pack by illingsh, the date given

Why is a phased start so important?

- Pre-school and child care are very different environments from Reception
- A phased introduction works and reduces anxiety for the children as they are introduced to aspects more slowly
- A good start is vital



Keep us informed

- Read with your child we recommend the library and Lions Bookshop in the village for great books
 Play with your child – and let them play without you!
- Sleep and breakfast are vital for a good day at school
- Encourage them to have the free hot meal not pack lunches
- Come to school events especially parents' evenings
